Background Information:

Germany was appointed to hold the rotating OSCE Chairmanship in 2016. The function of the Chairperson-in-Office is exercised by the German Federal Minister of Foreign Affairs- Frank-Walter Steinmeier.

The OSCE is the largest security-oriented international organization in the world with a mandate encompassing arms control, human rights, fair elections, freedom of the press, conflict prevention and crisis management.

"Germany is assuming its new role in turbulent times. Facing what may be the most serious crisis to peace and security in Europe since the end of the Cold War, Germany stands ready to take on this responsibility." – Frank-Walter Steinmeier stated.

Wars result in waves of refugees. An estimated 50 million people are currently on the run.

We will talk with Gernot Erler about *the challenges and significance of the German OSCE*Chairmanship in 2016 and also about the Syria crisis, the Ukrainian Conflict, the role of Germany and Russia for international peace in the Near East and in the Ukraine
